

Lone Star Flag – 8” x 10” Finished Block

The Lone Star flag represents both the Republic of Texas and the State of Texas. Texas became a sovereign nation with the signing of the Texas Declaration of Independence from Mexico on March 2, 1836. Texas became the 28th state of the United States by treaty on December 29, 1845. While a proud member of the Union, Texas really is “a whole ‘nother country.”

1 4- 1/2” x 6-1/2” rectangle

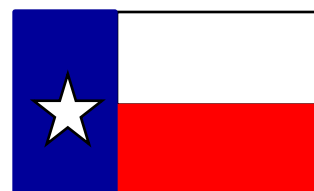
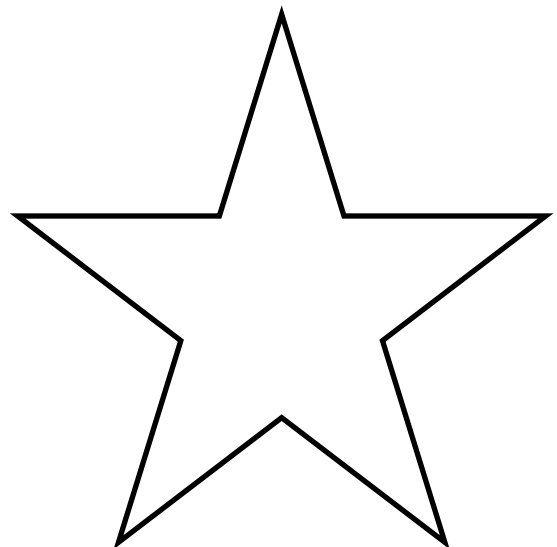
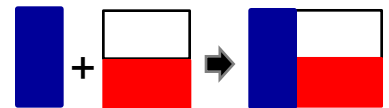
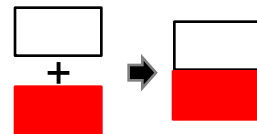
1 4- 1/2” by 8- 1/2” rectangle

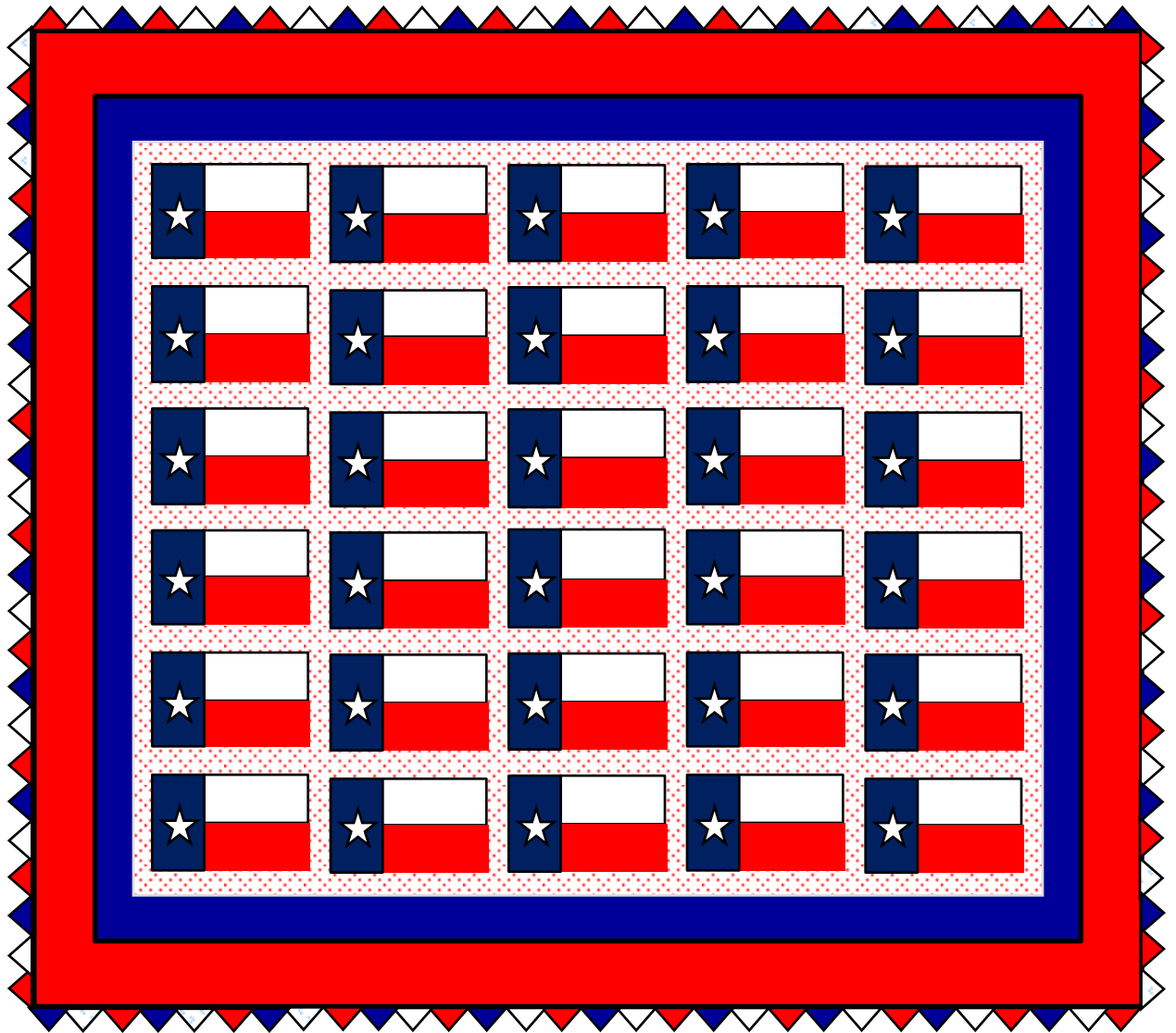
1 4- 1/2” x 6-1/2” rectangle

1 star shape *Template provided.*

Assembly – 1/4” seams allowed

1. Stitch the long side of the white rectangle to the long side of the red rectangle.
2. Stitch the navy rectangle to the white and red section. Note: White is at top of flag.
3. Prepare the star applique:
 - a. Trace the star shape provided on the paper side of a fusible web product such as Wonder Under®.
 - b. Fuse to the wrong side of the fabric you have selected for your star.
 - c. Cut the star shape.
 - d. Remove the paper backing from the star shape.
4. Add the star to the flag and complete the block.
 - a. With the fusible side down, center the star on the blue rectangle as illustrated.
 - b. Slide the centered star 1/4” to the right to account for the outside seam used to set your flag block. It will look slightly off center but is necessary for the star to be properly aligned in the finished quilt.
 - c. With a hot iron, fuse the star to the navy background. Do not slide the iron.
 - d. Zigzag around the outside of the star.





Quilt composed of 30 flag blocks with white sashing, red and navy borders, and red, white, and blue prairie points
